7. THREE PRINCIPLES

PILGRIM 1: What do you think are the most important elements in one's attitude when inspiring to God or loving God?

ADI: Loving God is the first condition. Loving God, serving God, being honest and faithful to oneself, being honest and faithful to others and the three principles that Baba has given for everyone to obey and follow. If he cares to, Baba says, that He gives him the seed of His blessings and he's a man who can ever become eligible to His blessings in full.

And that is, first of all as you say is love, unselfish, unadulterated love for God, unadulterated, unselfish love for the Master, the personification of God. God and the Avatar are no two things, it is one, which is obvious and reverse of the same [inaudible]. Avatar is God activised.

So, the first thing is, Baba says you have to evoke that love in your heart which is the most important thing, which is the most powerful thing of your life, of your being.

There is nothing in life which can, which is as powerful as what Baba calls love. Because it is, this love alone can dissolve human hatred for each other, animosity for each other. Nothing else can do it. No mechanical processes and no education curriculums or anything can really dissolve that love. Man will, in spite of all the scientific inventions and advancements, man will go on harbouring that ill feeling and that hatred for some other. It is only through love that man can become absolutely detached.

Now it is very difficult to have that love. So Baba says, "We can't distribute our love for the whole of the humanity."

So you place your love at the feet of one who loves the whole world. So if you give love, dedicate your love to a personage who loves the whole world, then your love is diffused over the whole world.

We on our own cannot do it. That is why I say, "You detach yourself mentally from everything else and make me your primary attachment. That means love me the most and keep that love in your heart as the most precious thing of your life."

You can attend to all the duties of your life. Baba doesn't ask you to renounce anything physically at all.

And then there are two things Baba asks us to save from involvement into deeper impressions and deeper maya and illusion. And the other two things are that one should not really claim anybody's money, money that belongs to anybody, woman that belongs to anybody. He should not covet anybody's money, he should not possess anybody's money. He should not possess woman belonging to anybody unless she is his own wife. These things are the main principles to build up the human character. And the rest of all the things are really very unimportant. The details could be worked out. But we involve ourselves into details and for the sake of one tree we lose the whole forest.

PILGRIM 2: Do you [inaudible] what Baba meant by holding on to His daaman [inaudible]?

ADI: Yes, holding on to His daaman means the same thing as I call love. To have and nurture His love, keep it ever fresh in your heart and keep as the most precious thing of your heart. And you know what love is, of course you have been loving your friend or somebody, your relative but in a far too greater measure we have to nurture and cherish that love within ourselves for one whom we believe to be the personification of God, the other side of God, whom we call the Avatar.
