CAROL: This is how. [Carol and pilgrims laugh]

And in his car was a picture of Yogananda and I didn't know who was and I asked him who that was. And I told him about Baba and we started talking. And he said that he had a ring. PILGRIM 1: [inaudible]. [pilgrims laugh].

ERUCH: Yeah.

PILGRIM 1: Pseudo masters.

ERUCH: Pseudo masters, yes. And theologians.

PILGRIM 1: I understand.

ERUCH: Are doing the work that I am deputed to do so I have no other duty except to just relax for a while.

PILGRIM 1: And this has to do with the ring?

ERUCH: No. [pilgrims laugh]

CAROL: Theorising.

ERUCH: Oh! [pilgrims laugh] You better involve yourself in skit writings. Have nothing to do with spirituality.

PILGRIM 2: Eruch, Adi told me once that he was giving a talk in. And he was giving some analogy of an automobile to the spiritual aspirant. We have to feed the right gas in, take care of this part of the engine and that and check the air in the tyres and he turned over to this one fellow who was there. And he said, "What do you think of it? How about that?" And the guy said, "Was it a Ford or a Chevrolet?" [pilgrims laugh] And Adi [inaudible].
