**ERUCH:** Nariman. Don, Nariman and Adi. They were there and we were there. Well then somehow or other you see we were at a place where there was a restaurant. And Baba said that we should take either tea or coffee or have some sort of cold drinks. But while we were at the table Baba said that He wanted to piddle. And I said, "Now where would be the toilet rooms and all and take Baba." Baba had just arrived you see after a long tour. With all the shaking there and a painful hip joint and all that. I looked around and there I saw 4 booths you see, telephone booths. At the place. So all of a sudden I got an idea, 'What harm is there if Baba's wheelchair is shoved in front of the booth you see just stands up and piddles there.' And I always used to carry a glass for Baba, handy. Something in which that He should piddle you see. That's the usual thing we used to do on tours and all that.

So Baba was taken there you see and Baba said, "Well, how will it be? Is it in order?" I said, "Baba it's my responsibility. Nothing happens." And I stood there you see as if chatting and Baba is trying to phone or something like that and everything was in perfect order. Nothing was wrong you see. So Baba piddled there in the glass and felt at ease. And then I brought Baba back to the table which was very nearby and then I cleaned the glass you see. I disposed of the urine and cleaned the glass and then again joined the company. In the meantime Donkin was busy trying to fix a retiring room you see for Baba. When he fixed the retiring room he came to Baba and said everything was ready and we had to go down somewhere. So, there was an escort he had brought and so he led us down.
