## PERFECT MASTERS

So we were there, and suddenly there was a stir. He's coming, he's arrived. And there we saw Narayan Maharaj walk in. There was such joy, such youth, such light. He was a small figure, but really unusual. Very—then I found that about Babajan, and of course Baba. The sun Himself. But it was so lovely to see that. And he came, joined hands, and he looked around to all of us, to the gathering. And then he stopped, gazing at mother, and he said, "Mother, you have come." Ohh, it meant a lot to mother. He recognized, sometimes my son doesn't recognize me. But you know Narayan Maharaj—[general laughter]

So, and then when we sat, and then she sat. First he sat on the other swing. Then everybody was told to sit. But there's a little girl who came and garlanded him. A girl about my age, and she garlanded him. So he turned to me, you see, how he's letting us know. By doing that he's letting us know, I know, that you all have come from Meher Baba. You're His mother and now he turns to me and says, "I too have a little sister, you know." But I found later that it was a cousin. Cousin sisters, in Hindus you also call cousin, sister, who came and garlanded him. And then like Baba, he had the post next to him. Some letters were there. And they were obviously in Marathi. And a minute later, he again looks at me and calls me to him. So I come, and he said, "Read this." Now it's a letter in Marathi, it is not printed. I

have not learnt Marathi, but it's similar to Gujarati. I know the Gujarati script and I know of course, I know the language. But to read a handwritten letter in like an [inaudible], it's totally different from a type. But by Baba's grace, I was able to read it. He was so pleased. He said to me, "You will always come first." I was so happy. My first thought was, Baba wanted me to come first in class, that's all I could think of. Because that's his seat. All of them in Maharashtra. But one day, I tell you something funny happened. I had a dream. That's the last thing I'm going to tell. I had a dream, because now that we're up on the perfect masters today.

**PILGRIM 2:** Did you meet Upasani Maharaj too?

MANI: Upasani Maharaj, yes. Oh yes! I was told that when I was three years old, I was sitting on his lap and he fed me on my birthday some rava. Vishnu Master told me. Of course, I don't remember. I have a picture of myself, and my uncle and aunt in Sakori. But I don't remember. But when I was eleven, I remembered. I mean I saw him. I saw Upasani Maharaj when I was eleven years old.
