ERUCH: Allah Hu, Allah Hu, Allah Hu, Allah. The car is being driven fast you know. But see how it was when Baba heard this. Said, "Stop the car." So we stopped it on the roadside because highway. So I stopped it on the roadside. And then we all got down. Locked the car. And then we went out in the direction of this voice that was coming out. And we are passing through forest area. And some distance say about two furlongs from the road inside we found that the noise was coming louder and louder. And sure enough there was a huge shrine hidden inside the thicket.
